MS River Road Run

The MS River Road Run, is a scenic, 2-day motorcycle ride raising money for the MS Society. This year marks the 39th year of the MS River Road Run and is held August 17 & 18, 2024. The ride starts at Leo's South in Lakeville heading through eastern Minnesota and into Wisconsin on the great scenic Alphabet roads. A lunch stop is hosted at Roostertail Bar & Grill in Durand, WI. The ride ends for the night at Riverport Inn &

Suites in Winona where riders and guests enjoy a Banquet with Silent and Live Auction to help raise money for the MS Society.

This is NOT a follow-the-leader ride. All riders start at Leo's at 9am, with many forming small groups or ride on their own for a total of 213 miles on Saturday. A route booklet with turn-by-turn directions is provided and the route is fully marked with orange MS RRR signs. This year we will also offer a route map to follow on your digital device. The riders are followed by sweep vehicles and safety information is provided to all riders.

The host hotel for the night is the Express Suites Riverport Conference & Event Center. A discount for rooms is provided to the MS RRR riders (information on the MS RRR website). A more direct route back to the Twin Cities is planned for the Sunday if riders choose to follow it.

All sizes and styles of bikes are welcome as well as cars. We accept riders on 2, 3 or 4 wheels! Pictured are Denise and Carl Wieman, who started riding and fund raising for the MS RRR in 2002 and have not missed a year since. Together, they have raised over \$103,000 for the fight against Multiple Sclerosis. Over the past 39 years, the MS River Road Run has raised over \$2.3 million!

As we move through this year, keep thinking about who might fit the bill for each of these specialty awards. (I recommend maybe making a little note to yourself each weekend so you don't forget when voting season comes around, but, you do you.)

Captain Hazelwood

Volunteer Points

What are they, Who gets them, What are they good for?

What are volunteer worker points?

Volunteer worker points are how the CRA recognizes a volunteer's commitment to the club and awards CRA swag at certain point levels. Volunteer points are also used to track active volunteers, how often they volunteer, and their volunteer specialties.

The club uses this information for a few different purposes.

- Creating the volunteer gate list for each race weekend
- Ensure we have a large volunteer base to staff the race weekends
- Identify specialties that may require additional volunteers

Who earns volunteer worker points?

Volunteer points are awarded to CRA members who provide their time and effort to support the club. There are 3 general ways to earn points.

- Volunteer during a race weekend
- Volunteer for special events and club positions
- Volunteer referral program



Earning points during a race weekend

Volunteers can earn up to 7 points per a race weekend, 1 on Thursday, and 1 or 2 points each on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday depending on the specialty and amount of time volunteered.

^{*}A volunteer can only earn a maximum of 2 points per day regardless of specialties worked/time committed.

Earning points for special events/club positions**

Points can be earned by volunteering during special events where the CRA has a vendor booth such as the Donnie Smith Bike Show, Flood Run, MotoAmerica, Forgotten Star Brewing Motorcyle night host by The Litas. In many cases these events pay double points.

Certain club positions also earn additional volunteer points because the time/effort committed outside of the race weekends. These positions include the Board of Directors, Newsletter Editor, and Race Stewards.

Volunteer Referral Program

Refer a new worker to the CRA and earn 10 points for yourself, and 5 points for the new worker. To earn the referral points the new worker needs to earn 3 volunteer points AND complete their CRA membership on Motorsportreg.com. Once the criteria has been met, please email Workerliaison@CRA-MN.com to claim your bonus points.

ie. A full day of corner working and air fence tear down only earns 2 points

Incentive for recruiting new volunteers!

In addition to the worker bonus points incentive that has been in place for several years, we are now offering an incentive for racers who refer volunteers! The requirements of the new volunteer are the same as the requirements through the worker bonus points program (see below). For the racer incentive, the referring racer will receive a \$25 coupon code valid for CRA events!

Recruitment bonus points/coupon requirements:

- 1. The "new" volunteer must have never volunteered with the CRA previously.
- 2. The "new" volunteer must fill out a membership application on that first weekend they volunteer, and have it on file with the membership director.
- 3. The "new" volunteer must list the "referring" volunteer or racer on their membership application.
- 4. The "referring" racer/volunteer must also have already or will need to fill out a membership application, and have it on file with the membership director.
- 5. The new volunteer needs to earn 3 worker points
 - 1 point is earned for each half day worked
- 6. The recruiting worker will then receive 10 bonus points or the recruiting racer will receive a \$25 coupon code valid for CRA events; and the new volunteer will receive 5 bonus points.
